- **a. Pumpkin Smash Debrief** Worked through cold and windy weather. Follow-up on 15 minute educational bit each month. 1.18 tons of pumpkins composted. Second location in works for next year, Mayfair had parking lot construction this year.
- b. Tree Canopy
 - a. Westchester's Municipal Canopy Summary between 2010 and 2020 our canopy dropped 4% from 30% to 26%. Below county average. Less plantable space. SC-2014-2015 cut 827 mature ash from Emerald Ash Borer. Severe weather a factor with recent micro burst 39 tree lost on public parkway trees. 2022 removed 142, 39 just one storm. Way down on removals, was 179 trees or more a year. Now planting more than taking down, 182 trees planted this year. New species, ironwood, scarlet oak, chestnut oak, shingle oaks, swamp and white oaks, catalpa, American linden.
 - b. Public Works planted several species of native trees, waiting for grant to see what the tree inventory is so that we can mix in a variety of trees. On year 2 of 10 year plan to have an urban forest. Happy with PW is happy with tree vendor, have been with them since 2008. The relationship is valuable, the pricing is good, they plant the trees. The grant is still TBD.
 - c. There are several issues in the Chicago region many trees are young, many trees are invasive species like buckthorn, many are susceptible to invasive pests. More education to our residential land owners on healthy hedges and noxious trees.
 - d. ACTION ITEMS: Need to update ordinance if we get the grant. Would like to do more tree-focused events, including public land owners together to talk about trees, and invasive species mitigation. Evie offered to help on the village side to set something up. Public Tree Summit in future for community education.
 - e. LeeAnn encouraged everyone to read the Morton Arboretum Tree Census Report which provides a lot of information.

- f. The new exotic weed bill allows for us to take action and see how we can coordinate to educate residents on soil health, flood plain, insurance, etc. Evie mentioned that education is key because there are 17k people who can do something, vs village resources. If we talk about flooding, people will listen.
- g. Amendment to Illinois Exotic Weed Act, have Westchester update the ordinance to reflect state law. Sent email to Jim regarding buckthorn and adjust milkweed to reflect common milkweed not all. Reference July newsletter article.
- h. Steve people don't know why we are moving to all native trees, seconds the education piece. We assume people know more than they do, they see trees around the village that we wrongly planted in the 90s and want them, if they are educated on why, they have an understanding.
- i. Evie: As a village, let's see if we can get a nursery to work with us to discount native trees for residents. We should ask for volunteers for a Buckthorn committee to spot and report it (call it the buckaroos). If the Village removes buckthorn and educates residents, it would be a good first step.

b. Bee City




