- a. Community Energy Planning Grant - RFP status
 - i. Annie: Drafting for it to be reviewed by attorney, will be live in a few weeks.
- b. GRC – Greenest Region Compact baseline scoring update
 - i. Focused on what we know has been achieved, if not, marked as “not planned” based on knowledge. Next steps would be to choose goals to prioritize. GROW to discuss special meeting. We could create a sustainability report to highlight what is accomplished and use it for a climate action plan and/or sustainability plan.

- a. Anti-Idling Legislation – Liz
 - i. Liz found two IL statues regarding the Village acting on anti-idling. Evie discussed with Jim Novosel – complex issue. They are reviewing how something would be put together and enforceable so that the officers would understand when applicable and how and when it could be enforced. Discussion of timeline, but there is no clear deadline.

- ii. Mariana discussed an issue with SBC, policy vs citizen outreach, if this issue could be solved with an RFP.
