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The Village of Westchester is located in Cook County, Illinois, 13 miles west of the Chicago Loop. Except for a handful of old farmhouses scattered throughout the Village and a few streets named after German farmers who once owned the land, little remains of the nearly 150-year history of farming in the area that became Westchester. The Village name, the vast majority of street names, and a few homes built in the 1920s provide clues to the founders' plans for a model English-style town, which was thwarted by the Great Depression.

Plans for the Village of Westchester began when utilities tycoon Samuel Insull and associates purchased approximately 2,200 acres of farmland in 1924. A native of London, Insull wanted the new suburb to be a model English town. The planned extension of the Garfield Park rapid transit line from Chicago made this location ideal for suburban development. Westchester incorporated in 1926. Several real estate developers directed the construction of paved streets, sidewalks, sewers, and street lamps, plus the laying of water mains and the planting of parkway trees. The all-English street names chosen by Insull and the construction of houses and apartments of brick, stucco, and hand-hewn timbers set Westchester apart from many other Chicago suburbs. Completion of the rapid transit line to 12th St. (Roosevelt Road) in 1926 and to 22nd St. (Cermak Road) in 1930 enabled prospective buyers to view properties in Westchester.

Construction came to a halt in the 1930s as many properties were tied up in contract and tax delinquencies. The clearing of these delinquent properties after World War II initially caused construction here to lag behind other nearby suburbs. Westchester's biggest gain in population occurred between 1950 and 1960 as the village grew from 4,308 to 18,092, and the few English-style houses that had been built before the Depression were surrounded by Georgians, ranches, and split-levels. With the removal of the rapid transit line and the building of expressways in the 1950s, transportation in the postwar era shifted its focus. Westchester's proximity to the Eisenhower Expressway (Westchester's northern boundary) and to the Tri-State toll-road (near the village's western boundary) became increasingly important to Village residents.

In the 1980s, some of the remaining farmland became the Westbrook Corporate Center, a cluster of five 10-story office buildings near Cermak Road (22nd Street) and Wolf Road. This expanded the commercial tax base of the almost entirely residential village. Residential construction south of the Westbrook development in the 1990s has used up all but one tract of open land within the Village—the 85-acre Wolf Road Prairie, which has been spared development, largely through the efforts of the Save the Prairie Society, active in Westchester since 1975. An Illinois State Nature Preserve, this prairie is but a small, rare remnant of the vast prairies that once covered much of Illinois.

UTILITIES

Water and sewer services are provided by the Village of Westchester. Residents are billed bi-monthly for water and sewer usage and garbage collection. Water and sewer usage is billed per 1,000 gallons. Residents 65 years of age and older qualify for a discounted rate for garbage service. To apply for the rate, call Village Hall at (708) 345-0020.

Ways to Pay Your Utility Bill:

Water & Sewer

- Pay in person, by mail, or drop off in front of Village Hall in the white box outside labeled "Village payment only."
- Set up automatic debit payment from your checking or savings account by completing the application form found on our website. Submit the completed application along with a voided check in person or by mail to Village Hall.
- Utilize E-Pay services to pay online. Click on the "Online Payments" tab on our website homepage, then click "Water/Rubbish/Sewer Bill" and enter your 11-digit account number.

Garbage & Recycling

Garbage and recycling is picked up by SBC Waste Solutions from curbs and alleys once a week. To view the pickup schedule, visit www.westchester-il.org/garbageprogram. PERMIT Information

Permits are required when:

Permits issued by the Village are required when you erect, construct, alter, enlarge, or move any building or structure on your property including (but not limited to):

- -Additions, Remodels, and Demolitions
- -Installation and/or Alterations of Plumbing, Electrical, and Mechanical Systems
- -Roofs, Tuckpointing, Siding, and Gutters
- -Windows
- -Fences
- -Pools & Hot Tubs
- -Sheds
- -Solar Panels
- -Concrete/Asphalt
- -Dumpster/Container



Building Codes that must be followed during permitted work can be found in Title 14 of the Village Municipal Code which can be accessed under the "I'm looking for" tab on the Village website homepage, or by clicking here.

Permit cards and Village approved plans must be on site at all times.

Permits are not required when:

Permits are not required for the following work:

- -Painting
- -Replacement of flooring
- -Ordinary repair work incidental to the upkeep of a building or structure

Permit Applications

Permit Applications are available in-person at the Building Department and on the <u>Village website</u>. Permit Applications may be submitted in-person at the Building Department or via email at <u>Building@westchester-il.gov</u>.

Please review the entire Permit Application to ensure all proper paperwork and requested documents are submitted. **All work must be performed by contractors registered with the Village of Westchester.** A list of all registered contractors is available at the Building Department and on the <u>Village website</u>.

Ordinances

If you have any questions related to Village Ordinances or would like to report a possible Code violation, please call the Building Department at (708) 345-0199. Residents should review the Village of Westchester's Municipal Code which can be accessed on the <u>Village website</u>. Here are a few ordinances to keep in mind:



Vehicle stickers are required and may be purchased at any time throughout the year. They are valid for one year; stickers can be purchased from March 1 through April 30. Vehicle stickers purchased after April 30th will have an increased fee.

Vehicle stickers must be purchased for all vehicles housed in Westchester, as well as for all vehicles that are registered through the State of Illinois with a Westchester address. For example, vehicles that may be used at a second residence that are registered to their Westchester address are required to have a Westchester vehicle sticker. All vehicles on Pelham St and Gardner Rd require an additional "P" Parking Sticker, at no additional cost. Please visit the Village website for more information on vehicle sticker fees.



Parking on Village streets during snow removal:

Between December 1st and March 31st, after a two-inch snowfall, except as otherwise posted, it is unlawful to park any vehicle, or to permit any vehicle to remain parked, on odd-numbered sides of the street on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and on even-numbered sides of the street on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays until said snow has been removed.

Parking on Village streets during street maintenance:

Between April 1st and November 30th, except as otherwise posted, it is unlawful to park any vehicle, or to permit any vehicle to remain parked, during certain weekdays on streets designated by the village for street maintenance as indicated by signs posted by the village.



Dog licenses are required. Every person who owns or keeps a dog within the limits of the Village shall report to the Village Clerk annually, on or before the first day of January of each year, his or her name and address, and shall give the name, breed, color and sex of each and every dog kept by such person within the Village, and shall present for the scrutiny of the Village Clerk a certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian indicating that the dog has been inoculated for rabies within one year previous to the date of application for license. There is no cost for a dog license.

Other Important Village Codes

- Grass/weeds cannot be higher than eight inches
- No vehicle may be parked on grass or unpaved areas
- Items/garbage cannot be left on parkway indefinitely
- · Garbage containers must be covered
- Garbage containers cannot be left out past garbage day
- Junk/debris cannot accumulate on your property
- Gutters cannot be placed in a manner as to create a nuisance to neighboring properties from drainage/runoff
- Street address numbers must be identified on property
