



#### From the desk of Village President Greg Hribal

As we have done for 22 years, Westchester honored the lives lost on September 11th. A flag lowering and solemn bell ringing ceremony at our village hall was attended by the Westchester Police, Fire Department, village staff and residents reflected on those who lost their lives on that very tragic day. A special thank you to Pastor Mills and our Cook County Commissioner Tara Stamps for their reflections on the events that occurred in 2001.

The Illinois Department of Transportation has started work on Cermak Road which is expected to take approximately one year. From I-294 in Westchester to Harlem Avenue in North Riverside they will be replacing approximately 6 miles of roadway and performing other sidewalk and crosswalk improvements. Please drive safely and consider alternative routes during this project if at all possible.

I know that the skunks have been a nuisance in our community this year, and it is not just those living by the forest preserves. Various factors caused the abundance of skunks in town, as have been reported in all of our neighboring communities as well. The village has updated our website to include information to assist residents in dealing with them. Additionally, the village recently approved a partnership with ABC Humane Wildlife to provide discounted pricing for Westchester residents who may need trapping services.

Please be aware that the Village Hall summer office hours have ended. Offices are open between 8:00am and 4:30pm Monday through Friday. The senior Secretary of State has increased their hours of operation, opening at 7:30am weekdays. For those unaware, the facility entrance is located at the Village Hall on Municipal Drive right next

to the post office parking lot. Seniors 65 and older can come in anytime, without an appointment, to renew their drivers license, purchase vehicle stickers or obtain a REAL ID for travel purposes. There are no wait times and most visitors are able to complete needs in under 10 minutes.

The Westchester Fire Department is hosting their open house on Monday October 7th from 6:30pm to 8:30pm at the fire station located at 10240 Roosevelt Road. Come out with the family and enjoy the evening with free food, entertainment and live demonstrations.

The semi-annual shred and recycle event will be taking place this on October 19th from 10am to noon at 2305 Enterprise Drive. The shredding of sensitive documents, such as bank or tax statements will be performed on-site along with the recycling of your old household electronics. Additionally, the Westchester Food Pantry will be collecting non-perishable food and monetary donations.

Join the Westchester Park District for the Veterans 5K Run & Walk along with the veteran's brunch will be on November 10. This special event honors and celebrates our Military Veterans, Active Duty, Reserves, and their families. The 5K run and 1-mile walk will start at 9:00 AM at Mayfair Park with the brunch beginning at 11am. - 2. AGE OR DISABILITY REQUIREMENTS:
  - PARTICIPANTS MUST BE 65 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, OR
  - HAVE A QUALIFYING DISABILITY AND AN ILLINOIS PERSON WITH A DISABILITY IDENTIFICATION CARD
- 3. NO PERSONS CAPABLE OF REMOVING SNOW CAN RESIDE IN THE HOUSEHOLD

# National Fire Prevention Week Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for You

The Westchester Fire Department is proud to support the National Fire Protection Association's (NFPA) Fire Prevention Week campaign, "Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for You," which runs from October 6-12, 2024. The NFPA has announced that this year's campaign focuses on the importance of smoke alarms and how to ensure they are working properly to protect your home and family.

#### **Full NFPA Press Release:**

The National Fire Protection Association® (NFPA®) – the official sponsor of Fire Prevention Week $^{\text{TM}}$  for more than 100 years – has announced "Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for You" as the theme for Fire Prevention Week 2024, October 6-12.

This year's campaign works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe. Smoke alarms save lives, but they need to be installed, maintained, and tested regularly to ensure they're working. The NFPA provides these key messages to ensure smoke alarms are effective:

- Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home, including the basement.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pressing the test button to ensure the alarm is working.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or if they don't respond properly when tested.
- Make sure everyone in the home understands the sound of the smoke alarm and knows how to respond.

"In a fire, mere seconds can mean the difference between a safe escape and a tragedy. Smoke alarms provide that critical early warning that can give you and your family enough time to get out safely," said Lorraine Carli, Vice President of Outreach and Advocacy at NFPA. "But they must be installed in the right places and tested regularly to make sure they are working properly."



# Never Forgotten: Reflecting on 9/11 and Our Community's Tribute

Last month, the Westchester community came together to honor the memory of those we lost 23 years ago on September 11, 2001. On that tragic day, terrorists attacked our nation, resulting in the loss of 2,996 lives—children, adults, firefighters, police officers, and everyday people, just like you and me, who were simply going about their daily lives.

The devastating images of the Twin Towers falling and the heart-wrenching decisions made by those trapped inside remain etched in our memories. Even after all these years, it feels like just yesterday that we witnessed those events unfold. I still remember exactly where I was when I heard the news that a plane had struck one of the Twin Towers. At first, it was hard to believe it was a terrorist attack, but as a former Marine, once the second tower was hit, I knew we were under attack. Despite being 40 years old at the time, I would have re-enlisted in a heartbeat to defend our country—because that's what veterans do.

During this past month, we held our annual 9/11 Commemoration Ceremony at Westchester Village Hall, where we reflected on that day and paid tribute to the bravery of those who served. We gathered as a community to remember and honor those who lost their lives, as well as those who stepped up to bring justice in the aftermath. The unity and strength that emerged during that time is a testament to the resilience of our nation.

As we move forward, I encourage

everyone to take a moment of silence to remember those who were lost, those who sacrificed, and those who continue to protect our freedoms. Alan Jackson's song, "Where Were You When the World Stopped Turning," serves as a poignant reminder of a time when our country stood united, filled with patriotic pride from coast to coast—something we could all use a bit more of today.





- All brush must be placed on the front parkway by 7am on your designated collection day.
- Branches must be stacked with the butt ends facing the street in the same direction.
- Dirt must be removed from any root balls.
- Public Works Crews will only pass through a designated collection area once due to time, scheduling, and other workload responsibilities. We do not collect branches on demand.

Landscapers & tree services are responsible for their own brush disposal.

This special collection must be pre-scheduled by calling 312-522-1115.


#### **Street Parking Restrictions**

- 1. The Village has been planting trees on eligible parkways at no cost to the resident. This replacement program does not allow for residents to choose the species of tree planted, the location, the number of trees planted, nor are residents able to opt-out of having a tree planted in the Village parkway in front and/or side of their residence. Please call Public Works if you would like to request a tree be planted sooner rather than later in a parkway.
- 2. If you would prefer to choose the species of the tree to be planted, this can be achieved through the 50/50 program. The resident can choose the tree(s) from a list provided by the Village, and shares half of the cost of the tree(s) and planting with the Village. To request the list of 50/50 trees, please call the Public Works Department at 708-345-0041.



# Westchester 2024 Pumpkin Smash



As Halloween approaches, so too does Westchester's 6th annual Pumpkin Smash brought to you by the Green Residents of Westchester (GROW). The Pumpkin Smash is an annual effort by communities to divert pumpkins from landfills by providing locations for residents to drop off jack-o-lanterns (minus candles) and other gourds to be composted.

It is held each year after Halloween and this year that will be on Saturday, November 2nd, and Sunday, November 3rd in Westchester. Items accepted include pumpkins, gourds, cornstalks, and hay bales.

Be sure to remove candles, stickers, pipe cleaners, and any non-compostable decorations before placing your pumpkins in dumpsters.

Many people are surprised to find out that Illinois produces three and a half times the amount of pumpkins as the second most productive states, Indiana and California (Source: USDA). So why bother to compost them instead of just throwing them in the trash?

Pumpkins are nutritionally valuable since they contain significant amounts of fiber, potassium, and protein. Pumpkins are also 90% water and thus when disposed of in a landfill these nutrients and water are lost from the environment rather than being recycled or reinvested back into the environment.

The decomposition of organic matter, such as pumpkins, produces greenhouse gasses. Landfills are the 3rd largest producers of greenhouse gasses so by composting them we can significantly reduce those emissions.

Composting any organic matter is also just plain beneficial. Compost reduces, and in some cases, eliminates the need for chemical fertilizers. It is a nutrient-dense soil amendment that can provide cost savings over conventional soil remediation. Lastly, compost enhances water retention in soils helping to reduce flooding in our yards and streets.

In 2023, Westchester joined with 95 other communities to divert pumpkins from making it into landfills. The event resulted in the composting of 482,000 pounds of pumpkins. This equates to a reduction of 173 tons of CO2 from entering the atmosphere and the diverting of nearly 52,000 gallons from entering landfills.

#### Leave the Leaves for a Healthier Yard and Planet

Fallen leaves provide essential habitat for wildlife, add organic matter to soil, help to prevent weeds, and reduce carbon emissions from transportation. By leaving leaves on the ground, you create a healthier lawn while supporting biodiversity in your backyard.

#### **Tips for Managing Leaves**

- Use a mulching mower to shred leaves directly on your lawn, leaving a thin layer of leaf debris.
- Rake excess leaves into garden beds or around trees and shrubs as a natural mulch.
- Add leaves to your compost pile to create a rich soil amendment for your garden.

#### **Preventing Itch Mite Bites**

- While you're managing your leaves, it's important to take precautions against itch mites, tiny pests that have proliferated in the wake of periodical cicadas. Here are some tips to help you stay bite-free:
- Wear long sleeves, pants, gloves, and a hat when working outside. Tucking pants into socks can prevent mites from getting to your skin.
- When handling leaves, avoid shaking them, as this can release mites into the air and onto your skin.
- After spending time outdoors, put your clothes in the laundry and take a soapy shower immediately to wash away any mites that may have landed on your skin or clothing.

It's pumpkin season! Whether making your own pumpkin puree or using canned, try these Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Bars for a dairy-free fall treat. Did you know dairy production contributes considerably to climate change, with carbon dioxide, methane, and nitrous oxide emissions (worldwildlife.org)? # <u>Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Bars</u> prep time: 10 mins. | cook time: 25 mins. |

total time: 2 hours (includes cooling)
makes 16 bars

#### Ingredients

3 cups (255g) old-fashioned whole rolled oats or quick oats (not instant)

- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon store-bought or homemade pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup (225g) fresh or canned pumpkin puree
- 1/3 cup (56g) unsweetened applesauce
- 1/3 cup (70g) coconut oil, melted
- 1/3 cup (80ml) pure maple syrup
- 1/4 cup (45g) coconut sugar (or packed light or dark brown sugar)
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

3/4 cup (135g) semi-sweet chocolate chips, plus a few to press into the top (use dairy-free to make it vegan)

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F (177°C). Line the bottom and sides of an 8-inch or 9-inch square baking pan with parchment paper, leaving an overhang on the sides to lift the bars out (makes cutting easier!). Set aside.
- 2. Pulse the oats in a food processor or blender until they're slightly broken up. (For whole oats, about 10 pulses. For quick oats, about 5-6 pulses.) Pour into a large bowl and add the remaining ingredients. With a rubber spatula or large spoon, stir together until combined. Mixture/dough will be very heavy and thick.
- 3. Spoon mixture into prepared pan. Using the back of a flat spatula or a spoon, spread and press it tightly down into the pan. Make sure it's flat and very compact, which helps guarantee the bars hold their shape. Dot a few chocolate chips into the top—this is optional and only for looks! I usually use about 1-2 Tablespoons on top.
- 4. Bake for 25-28 minutes or until the edges are very lightly browned and the center appears set. Avoid over-baking, which dries the bars out.
- 5. Remove from the oven and cool in the pan at room temperature for 30-60 minutes. After that, place the pan in the refrigerator for 1-2 hours until chilled.
- 6. Remove bars from the pan using the overhang on the sides then cut into squares.
- 7. Cover leftover bars tightly and store at room temperature for up to 3 days or in the refrigerator for up to 10 days.


