INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS



Imagine your daily routine – from the smooth commute along well-maintained roads to the seamless flow of water every time you turn on a faucet. These seemingly ordinary aspects are the backbone of our community's infrastructure. Roadways pave the way for easy travel, and water and sewer utilities ensure a constant, clean supply, They're not just structures; they are the silent architects of our convenience, shaping the comfort and quality of everyday life. We depend on this important infrastructure daily, so its maintenance and resilience is of the utmost importance. To continue providing residents with a smooth, safe and enjoyable daily experience, the Village of Westchester completed the following infrastructure improvements in 2023:

PARKWAY TREES

- Village-Wide Tree Inventory was completed in 2023 in which 6,845 trees were surveyed, and 1,701 planting spaces were identified. This milestone, coupled with the upcoming Management Plan, equips us with essential data to effectively manage and strategically enhance the Village's urban forest.
- The Village planted 187 parkway trees in 2023 as part of its ongoing Parkway Tree Replacement Program.

WATER METER REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

- The Village received a \$2.19 million ARPA allocation in 2023 that has allowed for the replacement of all residential water meters in the Village. The new meters read with 100% accuracy and can quickly detect a residential water leak.
- As of the end of December, 5,992 water meters have been replaced. Less than 350 replacements remain.

FIRE HYDRANT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

- The Fire Department & Public Works Department worked together to inspect and flush all 1,276 fire hydrants throughout the Village.
- During the inspections, it was found that 10 hydrants needed to be replaced and 123 hydrants required repairs. Public Works has completed all replacements and repairs.
- This program was crucial in ensuring our Fire Department has a reliable and efficient water supply throughout the Village.

POLICIES, PROCEDURES & ORGANIZATIONAL UPDATES

After joining the Westchester team, it was my goal to revamp Village policies and procedures as well as implement important updates and facility improvements to ensure effectiveness, efficiency, compliance and transparency throughout the organization. These strategic changes not only enhance the internal workings of our Village but also lay the groundwork for a more responsive and citizen-centric governance. While this is an ongoing effort, we're certainly on the right track as we head into 2024. Take a look at what we've been working on:


- Began rebuilding the Village's management team to align with the needs of the community and organization.
- Initiated three financial audits to bring the Village up to the current fiscal year, with completion scheduled over the course of 11 months.
- Negotiated with Public Works union & Sergeants union to establish mutually beneficial Collective Bargaining Agreements.
- Conducted a comprehensive Space Needs Study for the Administration, Police, Building, and Public Works Departments.
- Initiated a Pay and Classification Study for Village employees, incorporating a Performance Management element to be implemented in 2024.
- Updated the Village Personnel Policy Manual, last revised in 2006.
- Introduced onboarding and exit interviews for Village personnel.
- Reestablished regular attendance at Board of Fire and Police Commission meetings.
- Upgraded IT equipment to ensure reliable Village communications and partnered with Village of Hillside on IT services.
- Authorized the purchases of new body worn cameras for Police Department and a new ambulance stretcher for the Fire Department.
- Approved emergency circuit improvements at main Fire Station.
- Initiated HVAC improvements throughout Village Hall & Police Department.
- Engaged a professional to evaluate policies and procedures of the Economic Development Committee.
- Implemented Notary services at Village Hall.
- Collaborated with an actuarial firm to ensure sufficient budgeting for Police and Fire pensions.
- Conducted various contract reviews resulting in approximately \$200,000 in savings (e.g., HR software, T1 line termination, self-hosting phone services).
- Resumed monitoring and compliance efforts for RPZ and FOG programs.
- Amended the New Rental Residential Property Ordinance to include a Certificate of Inspection requirement.
- Amended the Code regarding Attendance and Order of Business for meetings to enhance efficiency and effectiveness.
- Implemented a Social Media Policy.
- Updated Purchasing Policy authority and procedures.
- Implemented a Purchasing Card Policy.
- Increased the frequency of online Municipal Code updates to monthly.
- Approved West40 Memorandum of Understanding.
- Formally joined and began engaging with Cross-Community Climate Collaborative (C4).
- Established intergovernmental agreement with Metropolitan Water Reclamation District for more green alley improvements.
- Created Westchester Special Events Committee to increase collaboration between the Village, Park District, Library, School District, and other local entities to enhance community events.
- Welcomed Secretary of State Senior Only DMV into Village Hall.
- Facilitated appraisals of Village-owned properties at Enterprise Drive and prepared the buildings for "cold storage."

IMPROVED COMMUNICATIONS



The Village launched a weekly digital newsletter in November 2023. The Westchester Weekly E-News recaps recent news and events and highlights what to look forward to in the near future. Within 6 weeks of launching, we surpassed 1,000 subscribers. Let's keep growing in 2024, encourage your local friends & family to sign up by directing them to the Village website!

In December 2023, we added a "Transparency Portal" page on our website. This dedicated space consolidates key topics of interest, providing a comprehensive resource for our community.
