This year, Olivia won first place in her regionals, leading her team to an unprecedented fourth-place finish and a historic qualification for sectionals. She also recently committed to continuing her academic and bowling career at Morgan State University. Her dedication and talent continue to inspire young athletes in the community.

SOPHIA COLLINS (CURRENT VILLAGE CLERK)

Sophia Collins is a proud Westchester resident dedicated to serving her community. A devoted mother of four, grandmother of twelve, and great-grandmother of five, she brings a natural warmth and leadership that inspires those around her. DARLENE BARBER (EDC – FIRST AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMAN & LONGEST SITTING MEMBER)

Darlene Barber has been a Westchester resident for nearly 26 years and is the founder of Scream Evangelistic Outreach Ministries, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit advocating for domestic violence survivors since 2007. She also owns Divinely Inspired Elegant Events LLC and Divine Landscape Design. As the first African American woman and longest-serving member of Westchester's Economic Development Committee, she has dedicated herself to community service, also serving on the Friends of the Library Board and other mentoring programs.

PATRICIA MITCHELL-BRAXTON (ACTIVE RESIDENT VOLUNTEER)

A Westchester resident for 27 years, Patricia worked for 25 years in Information Technology at General Electric. Under his leadership, Illinois has passed historic legislation to promote fair education funding, strengthen healthcare access, and increase diversity on corporate boards. He was the chief sponsor of the Illinois Trust Act, ensuring Illinois remains a welcoming state for immigrants. Before

serving in the legislature, he spent 12 years on the Proviso Township High School Board of Education, including 10 years as Board Chair, where he played a key role in founding the Proviso Math and Science Academy, one of the top-ranked schools in the state.

Speaker Welch's dedication to uplifting communities and creating a more just and inclusive future continues to shape Illinois in meaningful ways. His leadership ensures that opportunity, fairness, and progress remain at the forefront of the state's future.

SENATE MAJORITY LEADER KIMBERLY A. LIGHTFORD

She also played a key role in creating the Illinois Department of Early Childhood to strengthen support for young learners.

A fierce advocate for workers' rights, Leader Lightford led the fight to raise the minimum wage to \$15 per hour, helped pass Illinois' Equal Pay Act, and secured guaranteed paid leave for all workers. As the former Joint Chairman of the Illinois Legislative Black Caucus, she spearheaded a groundbreaking four-pillar agenda to address systemic racism, focusing on criminal justice reform, education, workforce development, economic access, and healthcare. She also championed efforts to make Juneteenth a state holiday and designate February 28 as Black Women's History Day.

Deeply committed to uplifting communities, she has launched initiatives like Uplift Our Future, cancer awareness programs, and support networks for grandparents raising grandchildren. A proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., she continues to serve Illinois with passion and dedication, shaping policies that create lasting change.

MAYOR RORY HOSKINS (FOREST PARK)

Mayor Rory E. Hoskins has been a dedicated leader in Forest Park since his election in 2019, making history as the village's first African American mayor. Prior to this role, he served as a village commissioner from 2007 to 2015, becoming the first African American elected to public office in Forest Park. During his tenure as commissioner, he was instrumental in establishing the village's Diversity Commission in 2015 and initiated the annual Juneteenth celebration in 2009, reflecting his commitment to inclusivity and cultural awareness.

Under Mayor Hoskins' leadership, Forest Park has seen significant community engagement and development. In 2019, he convened residents to launch the village's inaugural Hispanic Heritage Month event, celebrating the rich cultural diversity of the community. Mayor Hoskins has also been

proactive in addressing public safety concerns, advocating for increased state funding to enhance security measures following incidents affecting the community.

Beyond his mayoral duties, Mayor Hoskins has demonstrated a strong commitment to youth and community service. He has been actively involved with the Forest Park Youth Soccer program since 2005, serving as a board member, coach, and parent.

Mayor Hoskins' visionary leadership continues to foster a more inclusive, safe, and vibrant community in Forest Park.

MAYOR KATRINA THOMPSON (BROADVIEW)

In 2017, Mayor Katrina Thompson made history as the first African American woman elected Mayor of Broadview, a milestone for both the community and leadership in Illinois. Under Mayor Katrina's leadership, Broadview has remained committed to progress, equity, and social justice.

That commitment was evident in 2017 when Mayor Katrina led Broadview to become the first municipality in Illinois to recognize Juneteenth as a paid holiday for municipal employees, years before it gained national recognition. This decision honored the significance of June 19, 1865, when the last enslaved African Americans in the Confederacy learned of their freedom.

Mayor Katrina also prioritized education and empowerment, leading Broadview to establish the Broadview Freedom School at Lindop School—the first of its kind in Proviso Township. Inspired by the Freedom Schools of the 1960s, this program provides students with a curriculum focused on history, civics, and the arts, fostering informed and engaged young leaders.

Through her leadership, Mayor Katrina's pioneering efforts demonstrate her commitment to leading by example. Broadview continues to strive towards creating a community that is inclusive, educated, and empowered, setting new standards for what it means to lead with integrity and vision in the 21st century.

MAYOR ANDRE F. HARVEY (BELLWOOD)

Mayor Andre F. Harvey has been a dedicated leader and lifelong resident of Bellwood, making history as the village's first African American firefighter, fire chief, and mayor. Since taking office in 2017, he has prioritized public safety, youth development, and community growth.

With a career spanning over three decades, Mayor Harvey has led major improvements in fire and emergency medical services, enhancing ambulance care with advanced paramedics. Before becoming mayor, he served as Director of Public Safety, overseeing both the Police and Fire Departments to strengthen community safety.

His leadership extends beyond public safety, with a strong commitment to youth mentorship and education. Mayor Harvey established the Bellwood Teen Zone, the first facility of its kind in Proviso Township, providing a safe, supervised space for study and social activities. He also founded

mentorship programs and the Lady Dribblers girls' basketball program, empowering young people through sports and guidance.

Through his vision, leadership, and dedication, Mayor Harvey continues to shape Bellwood's future, ensuring it remains a thriving, safe, and supportive community for all residents.

MAYOR NATHANIEL GEORGE BOOKER (MAYWOOD)

Mayor Nathaniel George Booker, a third-generation resident of Maywood, has been a transformative leader, serving as Mayor since 2021. Before his election, he was a Village Trustee and Economic Development Commissioner, working to strengthen the local economy and infrastructure. Under Mayor Booker's leadership, Maywood has secured over \$25 million in infrastructure funding and launched Healthy Maywood West Cook, an initiative addressing community health and wellness.
